

I hope you are well.

I am sure so many of you are feeling confused, frustrated and overwhelmed after all the recent events. Firstly, I just want to let you know that we at SnapRevise are here for you. Staying committed to our mission of **helping every student achieve their potential**, I am beginning to start some free initiatives (read below) for those who don't currently have access to our platform. I am also in the process of ramping up our onsite tutor support/webclasses as well as releasing a new tailor-made product specifically built to support students now learning independently at home that will be available in early April.

Let's start by explaining the current situation, as there is still a lot of confusion - many of you still believe exams have been cancelled and that's the end of it. On **Friday 20th March** the government announced how grades are being awarded - you can read the full article [here](#). As a summary, in late July you will receive a 'calculated grade'. It will be a combination of your teacher's judgement of your performance based on your mock exams and non-assessment, along with other prior attainment. **Importantly, if you do not feel your calculated grade is representative of what you would have achieved, you can sit an exam once schools are open again, likely in September.**

So what does this mean for you?

- If you are a **Year 12 Student**: You are now stuck at home with limited teaching support and are at real risk of falling behind on preparation for your 2021 exams.
- If you are a **Year 13 Student**: You risk receiving a 'calculated grade' based on your mock exams that doesn't accurately reflect what you would have achieved in June, and could put your admission to university in doubt. If you don't want to rely on your teacher-calculated grade there is a very real chance you will still be writing your A-level exam when schools open again. This is frightening as you now have to prepare for the biggest exam of your life with limited teaching support.

In response to this, we've now set up our new 'Home Study Club'. You'll now be able to join our **FREE** daily YouTube Livestream group sessions, where you'll tackle pre-planned questions together with your tutors in a fun and interactive way, and get the crucial support you need.
